



WI can become addictive – there are so many things you can get involved in – we have 7 different groups outside of the main WI meetings






The Craft group, formed last year, has gone from strength to strength, with lots of interesting activities, thanks to Annette









Lots of interesting visits this year. The highlight was our summer Garden Party, thanks to Sue Roberts and Jonty for their hospitality










